

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE WHEELING HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF NOVEMBER 19, 1997

The meeting of the Wheeling Historical Society was held on November 19,1997 and was called to order at 7:55 p.m., by President Schnaitmann at the Wheeling Community Center, 251 North Wolf Road, Wheeling, Illinois 60090.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

The pledge of allegiance was led by the President. There were ten members were in attendance. Commissioner Klumpp, Park Liaison was also present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The minutes of the meeting of October 22, 1997 were submitted for approval. Dolly made a motion, seconded by Lorraine to approve the minutes as presented. Motion Carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Treasurer's Report was read in full. Treasurer Hein also advised that Lollipop monies are coming in and the donations received this summer from the museum totaled \$47.00 which when deposited with dues received, totaled \$250.00. She gave further details and motion was made by Linda Reading seconded by Lonnie to approve the Treasurer's Report as read. Motion Carried by voice vote.

2. Volunteers - Frank advised volunteers are needed for the museum. Patti and Lorraine are sitting next weekend but someone is needed for the 30th. Discussion ensued and it was agreed the museum would be closed following Thanksgiving. A sign will be posted.

It is a trip to the past in which participants experience history with the help of costumed actors and reenactments. It is hoped the society would be interested in such a project. Discussion ensued and it was requested this item be brought up at the January meeting.

While this is fresh in my mind, I thought I would share with you the meeting of N.E.IL (North Eastern Illinois Historical Council) which was held on Saturday, January 10th, 1998 at 9:00 a.m. and hosted by the Northbrook Historical Society.

Following the general meeting, there were two or I should say three presentations. One was given by Donna Schudel, who has worked many years in museums. Her presentation today was Mannequin Renovation, which we found to be quite interesting. Frederick Redinger of Fredrick Stain Glass presented the means of repair and care of stained glass which also proved to be quite interesting. Jan Harman President of N.E.IL had available some costumes which had been cleaned and properly stored in acid free boxes and for those interested, she talked about the care and storing of vintage clothing. Never knew that special soaps, tissue paper and boxes were needed for storage of those items. This was quite an interesting meeting.

Following the meeting, Wedge and I toured the Northbrook Historical Museum. There are three floors, the top containing a home of the late 1800's, the main floor holds artifacts and at this time their exhibit of "Shermerville" which it was called before Northbrook. Also it contained a small store which they sold items on consignment. Seventy five percent went to the individual and twenty five percent went to the society. The lower level contained the meeting room, bathrooms, kitchen, etc. If anyone is interested in seeing the museum, they are open on Thursdays from 9am to noon and Sundays from 2-4 p.m.

Between the meeting of N.E.IL and seeing the Northbrook Historical Museum, we had an enjoyable time. Anyone interested in attending these meetings are welcome. The next meeting of N.E.IL will be held March 14th in Mt.Prospect, hosted by the Mt. Prospect Historical Society. This way you not only get interesting information but its a chance to see museums in other towns.


