


SCATTERED THOUGHTS







Strawberry Walnut

Salad

Cook's Kitchen

Tred onion, sliced thin 2 pints strawberries, cut in quarters 1 14½-oz. can Mandarin oranges, drained 1 head iceberg lettuce, chopped 1/4 red cabbage, cut julienne

1 bag spinach, washed and chopped 2 T walnut halves

Honey Poppy Seed Dressing (can also be purchased) 1/4 C white rice vinegar 2 T safflower oil 3 T honey 1/2 tsp. poppy seeds 1/8 tsp. freshly ground black pepper, or to taste

In a small bowl, whisk together all dressing ingredients. Taste; adjust seasonings. Whisk or shake dressing before serving. Dressing will keep for one week in a tightly closed container in the refrigerator. Combine lettuce, cabbage and spinach. Place chopped greens in center of each salad plate. Place strawberries opposite each other around greens. Do the same with Mandarin oranges on opposite side. Slice red onion thinly over all. Center with walnut halves. Drizzle with Honey Poppy Seed Dressing. Serves 4.


