

#### N.E.IL


The N.E.IL meeting was held May 8th at 9:00 a.m. at Chamber Center.

Boston Corn Cake

cup flour ½ cup cornmeal

½ cup sugar 1 egg, well beaten 1 cup milk

3 teaspoons baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

1 tablespoon melted butter Combine and sift the dry ingredients. Add the other ingredients and bake in a shallow buttered pan in a hot oven (420° F.) about 20 minutes.


