#### HAPPY LABOR DAY

The first Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday September 5, 1882 in New York City with the plans of the Central Labor Union. Peter J. McGuire secretary of the brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners was credited with starting Labor Day. Now it is believed Matthew McGuire, a machinist, proposed the holiday.

Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New York created the Labor Day holiday by legislative enactment. It was celebrated with parades and picnics but now is observed on a more personal level.



1T Butter

1 lb. ground beef
