
A Message From The President — Terry Steilen

The church was built in 1865, and the original steeple was destroyed by lightning in @1938, rebuilt, and apparently struck again in @1958. The congregation decided not to rebuild. The bell was eventually moved to their new church on Highland Ave. where it sits today, just off the sidewalk in the front yard. We hope to gain their support by the end of the month.



- 1/2 cup soft bread crumbs
- 1/2 cup minced fresh parsley
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tsp. dried oregano

1 medium onion, chopped

2 cans (IS oz. each)


tomato sauce

1/2 cup water

1 tsp. Italian seasoning

Hot cooked spaghetti, optional

Flatten steak to 1/2-in, thickness. Rub with 1 Tbsp. oil. Combine the bread crumbs, parsley, cheese, garlic, oregano, 1/4 tsp. salt and 1/4 tsp. pepper. Spoon over beef to within 1 in. of edges; press down. Roll up jelly-roll style, starting with a long side; tie with kitchen string. In a Dutch oven, brown meat in remaining oil on all sides. Add onion and cook until tender. Stir in the tomato sauce, water, Italian seasoning, sugar and remaining salt and pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 70-80 minutes or until meat is tender. Remove meat from sauce and discard string. Cut into thin slices; serve with sauce and spaghetti if desired. Yield: 6 servings.





On January 14, 1982 frigid weather caused the crash of an airplane into 3 other planes after taking off from Palwaukee Airport.
