He began in Centerline, Mich., where he trained 100 Doberman pinschers at the Ponchatrain Kennels. His reputation as a trainer grew as a result of demonstrating his skill at the American Dog Club in Chicago. Willy conceived of the idea of a dog training school, something new in America. In 1935 he founded his school in Wheeling, where he resided. His fame also grew from appearances on television programs, including Bozo's Circus, Super Circus, The Ed Sullivan Show, Canadian network television and sports shows. In addition, while serving in the Coast Guard from 1942 to 1945, Willy trained Dobermans for military use by the Army and the Marine Corps fighting in the Pacific. He also trained dogs for John F. Kennedy and Rudy Vallee.

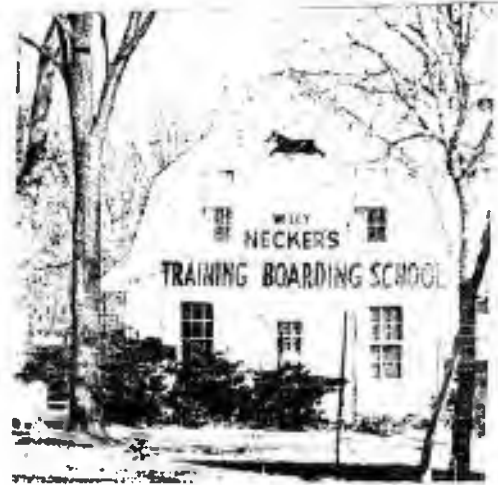

Remember Willy Necker's Boarding Kennel?
Here's a little history about the man as presented
in a small pamphlet we came across at the museum.

During World War II Lt. Cmdr. Necker headed up the Training work in the War Dog Unit of the Coast Guard. For two years he was loaned to the Army for a dog training program. His job was training both men and dogs for all-important war work such as sentry duty, guard duty, scout work, life saving, messenger duty and attack. Dogs were trained to alert handlers when on scouting trips. They were trained to do important casualty work- seeking out wounded.

All that, of course, was war work. But Willy Necker had his start long before World War II. At the age of 14, he started training dogs. His early schooling was in Germany. He had trained dogs for the famous people of screen, stage and radio. His dog acts have appeared on many of the country's best TV shows. He had trained some of America's finest hunting dogs and hundreds and hundreds of dogs for people who just want a pet.

In all, Willy Necker and his trainers have schooled more than 8000 dogs for varied useful duties- this does not include the thousands trained during World War II.

Willy Necker has received special citations from societies commending him for promoting kindness to animals. He is an honorary member of the Anti-Cruelty Society. Willy Necker's trained dog acts have gained international acclaim. His record in show and trail competition is one of the most impressive in the nation. He is one of the pioneers of today's popular obedience trails- some of his dogs have been used in making movies.

Former officer remembered for his heart

Former Wheeling police officer Ronald G. Nelson will be remembered for his caring heart.

Nelson, 69, who died Saturday at his Wheeling home of natural causes, touched the lives of many with his work in the military and law enforcement.

Nelson's ex-wife and longtime friend Nancy Nelson said he loved children, and really took it personally when he was on the department and would answer calls and find neglected children.

"I remember one case in particular. The department had received a well-being call about no adult on the site where there were three or four children," she said.

"He found these children hadn't been changed in days. He took them back to the department, where they cleaned them up, and he went to Kmart and bought them new clothes to wear," Nelson said.

Nancy Nelson said she recalled the children had been neglected by their mother, and that Nelson had gone out of his way to find the father.

"He always took it personally. He had a big heart. He was the best cop I ever knew," she said.

Ronald Nelson Jr. said his father loved being a cop.

"He loved serving the community. He had a big heart for others. With his family, he showed his love through action. I believe at 69 he lived a very

useful life," he said.

Nelson served in the Navy in the 1950s and was discharged due to injury in 1961, according to Nancy Nelson. He then went into law enforcement, working first in Park Ridge and then in Wheeling, where he worked in every facet of the department including contributing to the Chicago Crime Lab.

Wheeling Deputy Chief Bill Benson said Nelson had worked with Benson's father, who was a police officer in Park Ridge.

Benson said that according to department records, Nelson joined the Wheeling Police Department on Feb. 1, 1964, and went on disability pension in August 1982 as a lieutenant.

"We're sad to hear that he passed away. There's not a lot of people here today that were around when he was here, but we know that Nelson stayed active in the captain's association that met monthly," Benson said.

Nelson is survived by his ex-wife Nancy Nelson; sons Ronald C., David and Scott Nelson; and stepdaughter Samantha Cavanaugh.

Visitation for Nelson will be from 3 to 8 p.m. Wednesday at Kolssak Funeral Home, 189 S. Milwaukee Ave. in Wheeling.

Services will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday at the funeral home.

Following the services, a police escort will take Nelson to site of his military burial at Willow Lawn in Vernon Hills.

Former Wheeling Deputy Police Chief Ronald G. Nelson took great pride in helping people.

Mr. Nelson was a Navy veteran and a National Guardsman in addition to his more than 15 years as a police officer in the northwest suburbs.

"He was proud to be a policeman," said his son Ron. "He especially liked helping kids who were basically good kids but getting into trouble and just needed a push in the right direction."

Mr. Nelson, 69, died of a stroke Saturday, Jan. 20, in his Wheeling home.

He grew up in Lincoln Park, graduated from Lane Tech High School in 1955 and joined the National Guard. He was stationed in Glenview for three years, where he also worked as a firefighter with the Glenview Fire Department, his son said.

In the Navy, he was stationed in Long Beach, Calif. for 10 years, starting as a longshoreman and becoming a mechanic and test pilot, family said. "He kept the planes in working order during the Korean conflict," his son said.

When he returned to the Chicago area in the late 1960s, he joined the Park Ridge Police Department and made sergeant before moving to Wheeling. A lieutenant for much of his career, Mr. Nelson was appointed deputy chief and named acting police chief in the early 1980s. He retired in 1983.

"Wheeling wasn't an action-packed town, but he knew he was helping people every day," his son said.

Mr. Nelson was a member of many police organizations.

"He was respected by his peers," said Tony Scarpelli, deputy police chief in Skokie. "He frequently offered advice."

Mr. Nelson was a member and past president of the Northwest Suburban Shrine Club. Family said he would load the trunk of his Cadillac with Vidalia onions for fundraisers.

Mr. Nelson was married to his first wife, Nancy, for 25 years. Before they divorced in the early 1980s, he married his second wife, Saynde, in 1988. She died of cancer four months ago.

In addition to his son Ron, Mr. Nelson is survived by two other sons, David and Scott; a stepdaughter, Samantha Cavanaugh; his mother, Viola; two sisters, Linda Fruzyan and Lori Jefferson; and eight grandchildren.

Diane Nicholson succumbed to cancer last week. Her husband, James, lost his wife of almost 39 years and the mother of their two children. He lost his travel partner, his fellow football fan and his opera companion.

The Nicholsons' children followed their parents into the field of education. Kevin Nicholson, who lives in Lake Zurich, teaches science at Aptakisic Junior High School in Buffalo Grove. Their daughter, Heidi, who lives in Bolingbrook, works as a substitute teacher.

Diane Nicholson was a veteran teacher at Frost Elementary School in Mount Prospect when Gregg Crocker became the school's principal. Crocker said she was somebody who could always help out with problems he was facing as an administrator. He described her as an innovative teacher who was on top of new strategies and always willing to try new things in the classroom.

"She always had lots of ideas," Crocker said. "When she offered suggestions, people lis-

tened. She was very aware of and knowledgeable of new practices in teaching."

Crocker said Nicholson was instrumental in establishing the year-round continuous learning calendar used at Frost and worked as an intersession instructor after she retired in 2001. She served the district for a total of 32 years. She also worked on developing the school's early childhood program.

"We have a wide range of students in academic ability and English ability," Crocker said. "She could work with them all and help fellow teachers do the same."

Crocker said Diane Nicholson and her husband were always at after-school events. They saw book fairs and ice cream socials as a way to help promote the school.

Community loses longtime teacher

Gibson said Nicholson worked tirelessly during the construction years.

"I can still hear her laugh. She had just one of those delightful,

musical laughs."

Despite her cancer diagnosis in 2000, Nicholson continued to teach and travel. She served on the St. Mary Parish Breast Cancer Ministry and in 2001 was a featured speaker at the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Kick-off Breakfast at the Fremont Hotel in Chicago.

Karen Preston, head of the breast cancer support group at St. Mary said, "She was a lovely, sweet person with a very positive outlook who cared about other people."

Preston said Nicholson knew for some time that her cancer had metastasized, yet, "She would still come to meetings with a smile on her face."

"She absolutely glowed when she talked about her grandchildren," Preston remembered, adding Nicholson was particularly thrilled when her granddaughter was named after her.

In addition to her involvement with her library and her church, Nicholson made time for bridge, book discussion groups and travel. Her travels

led her over the Yangtze River, the Rhine, the Rhone and the Mediterranean.

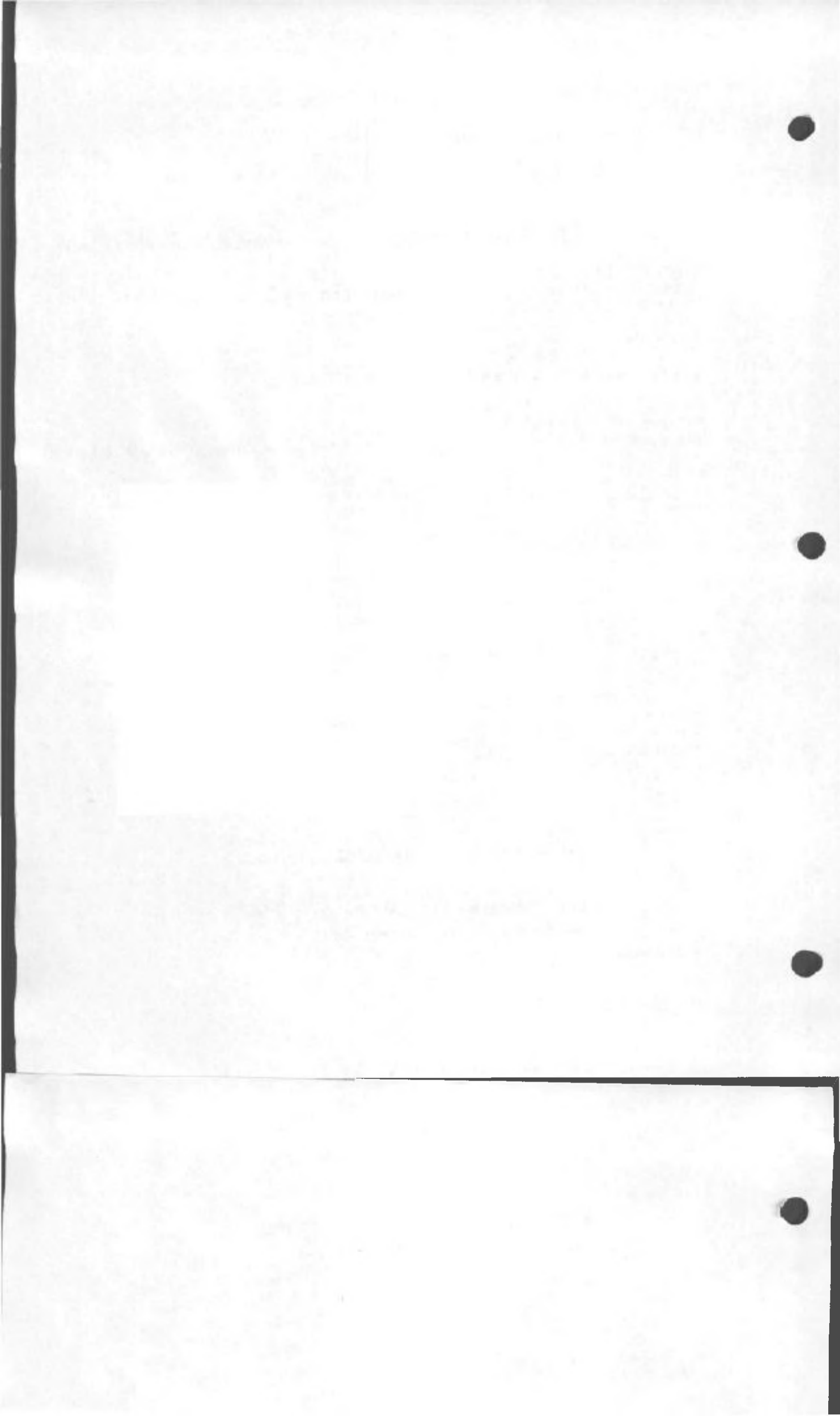

Decorated military pilot helped build airport

Esther Noffke of Wheeling was one of the original fly girls during World War II, the first female military pilots to carry out flight-related missions.

But when an author was preparing a book documenting those pilots' role in history, she had just one request.

"I just don't want us to sound frivolous," Noffke told the author of the 1992 book. "We weren't frivolous; we were really serious."

After the war, Noffke took her passion for aviation to the Northwest suburbs, where she was among the first three employees of Palwaukee Airport, helping to grow the air field from a flight-training school to the full-fledged business airport now known as Chicago Executive Airport.

Noffke died Friday. She was 91.

She joined Priester Aviation as a flight instructor in 1945 and later served as George Priester's assistant after he purchased the airport. She was credited with much of the development of Palwaukee, now called Chicago Executive Airport.

"She was one of the most focused persons I've ever met," said Charlie Priester, whose father, George, worked

with Noffke and Ed Konefes to build Priester Aviation, starting in 1945.

"My dad had a vision of growing Palwaukee Airport," he added, "and Esther was the behind-the-scenes person making it happen."

Noffke worked as a flight instructor at Palwaukee after earning her own wings with the Women Airforce Service Pilots, or WASP, in 1943. Of the 111 trainees who started in her class, she was one of only 49 to graduate from the program and earn her wings.

Nationally, from 1942 to 1944, more than 25,000 women applied to the WASP program, which was designed as a civilian program for women to serve as pilots and relieve men for

overseas duty, according to Armed Forces press records. Of those, only 1,102 women were accepted.

Noffke received her pilot certificate in June 1944 and was assigned to fly B-26 aircraft at McGowen Field, in Boise, Idaho.

She kept photos and other memorabilia from her historic flying days, as well as the early days of Palwaukee, in a section she transformed into a small museum.

Noffke also showcased her Congressional Gold Medal, which she and 200 other surviving WASP pilots were awarded in 2010 at the Capitol in Washington, D.C. Her national recognition came after Noffke was elected to the Illinois Aviation Hall of Fame in 1997.

Just last month, Charlie Priester said, Noffke decided to donate her collection to Southern Illinois University and its nationally ranked aviation department, where a scholarship in her name has been established.

Noffke never married but is survived by her sister, Hilda Schultz, and brother, Edward (Maggie) Noffke, and many nieces and nephews.

Visitation will begin at 9 a.m. today until a funeral Mass begins at 11 a.m. at St. Raymond de Penafort Church, 311 S. I-Oka St. in Mount Prospect.

'A giant' in history of the Northwest Suburban Bar Association dies at 90

Back in 1960, four local attorneys would meet at a local restaurant, hashing out ideas about starting a suburban bar association.

Initially, they envisioned it as a support network, but as

Life story the years went on, it evolved into a lobby-

ing group driven to making justice more accessible to residents living and working in the Northwest suburbs.

At 90 years old, Donald Norman was the last surviving member of that historic group of lawyers. He passed away on June 8.

Norman was honored in 2010, on the 50th anniversary of the Northwest Suburban Bar Association, which now has more than 650 attorneys. Norman was given the Founder's Award and recognized for his pivotal role in the group's founding.

"(Norman) was a giant to us young lawyers," says Ernest Blomquist, Arlington Heights village prosecutor.

"He was the senior member, a mentor, who everyone turned to at the time. He was great at making friends, and he knew everyone, all the judges and local attorneys."

Norman began his legal career as a staff attorney and legal affairs manager for Ryerson Steel Company, before opening his own practice in Arlington Heights, where he practiced until 1990.

In his early years of his practice, Norman served as village prosecutor for Wheeling, Buffalo Grove and on a stand-in basis for Arlington Heights.

When the Northwest Suburban Bar Association formed, the first meeting drew 24 attorneys. Norman was elected board secretary, a position he held for the next

10 years.

Norman also became involved in local politics. He was the Wheeling Township Democratic Committeeman from 1973 to 1982, working behind the scenes to help identify candidates and advance their campaigns.

But supporting the Northwest suburban legal community was never far from his thoughts, colleagues add.

"He was always a suburban practitioner, at a time when everyone was practicing downtown," says Ron Wittmeyer, incoming president of the NWSBA. "He worked to get more access to the courts and bring more practitioners out here."

Specifically, NWSBA officials say Cook County's Third Municipal District Courthouse in Rolling Meadows is part of Norman's legacy. Groundbreaking for the facility took place in 1986, and members of the bar association were on hand for its dedication in 1989.

"It wouldn't have happened without the push and pull of people like Don Norman and others like him who used their political forces to make it happen," said Blomquist, who was NWSBA president during 1986.

Bill Kelley, current NWSBA president and a Schaumburg attorney, says the courthouse not only made the judicial system accessible for local residents, but the kinds of cases it expanded to hear, made it easier for residents and practitioners alike.

He points to divorce and family law cases that now are heard in Rolling Meadows, as well as those in the law division, or cases that involve \$100,000 or more.

"One of our main goals remains to bring probate cases out here," Kelley says.

"We're drawing on the legacy of our founders, who sought to make the judicial system more accessible to residents in the Northwest suburbs."
