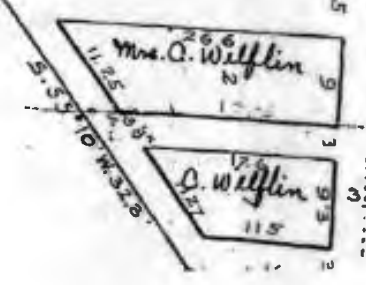

Wheeling officials dig into mystery of old cemetery

For the past 30 years, Wheeling officials have quietly been taking care of a small, unnamed cemetery at Wolf and Dundee roads, spending up to \$15,000 annually cutting grass and fixing its crumbling headstones.

They do it because no one else wants to.

No one is exactly sure who is buried there or what to do if someone wants to buy a plot. There are somewhere between 12 and 40 empty plots, said Jon Sfondilis, Wheeling's assistant village manager.

"The village doesn't have any record and has never sold any," Sfondilis said. "We're going to have to do some investigating and that may take some time."

On Monday, Trustee Dean Argiris asked village officials to research the cemetery so the board can figure out a policy. After all the cemetery dates back to the 1840s and isn't going anywhere.

"The taxpayers of Wheeling own that land," said Argiris. "If someone wants to buy a deed, we should have a policy."

Village President Judy Abruscato will be waiting. She'd love to call the cemetery home after she leaves village hall once and for all.

"I've lived in Wheeling my whole life, it would be perfect," she said. "Just put me in a jar and put me in the ground. People can wave as they drive past."

Right now, village officials don't know much about the cemetery. Sfondilis doesn't think it ever belonged to a specific church nor was it ever a cemetery for indigent residents. He's not sure if anyone well-known is buried there.

All of that will be researched. But Trustee Ken Brady can vouch it's more than 160 years old: He saw one headstone dated 1846.

Part of the new policy will be how much to charge per plot - for example, will the village discount lifelong Wheeling residents?

First, the village will have to figure out exactly how many open plots there are, which may be difficult. Some headstones are missing, and no one is sure if some open spots are unmarked graves or open space, said Village Manager Mark Rooney.

The cemetery fell into the village's hands in 1976 when a group of citizens who were taking care of it didn't want to anymore. They also handed over a \$8,700 savings account, Rooney said.

"We of course have used up that amount many times over," Rooney said.

The cemetery is about 100 yards by 100 yards and has about 300 plots. It sees occasional activity when someone dies and their family will produce a deed showing they own a plot.

That's where Louis Kolssak II comes in. He owns the Kolssak Funeral Home, Wheeling's only funeral home for "longer than people on that village board have been alive," he said.

Before the village took over ownership of the cemetery in 1976 Kolssak helped the two sisters who took care of the cemetery locate graves. He's been involved ever since.

Kolssak hasn't talked to village officials recently about the cemetery but said things working out there just fine.

"I don't know why they want to make a whole new policy when there are only 12 or 20 left," he said. "There are so many other things in the village that should be addressed. But whatever, they're the bosses."

Kolssak said he's buried only one person in the past four years at the cemetery.

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Wheeling tries to fill holes in cemetery's records

A few monuments have fallen. Some markers are cracked, tilted or sunk in the ground they have occupied since before the Civil War.

But the grass is carefully mowed, the trees are trimmed and Wheeling Cemetery looks ready to receive its next burial.

Ready, that is, if Wheeling officials knew how many plots are available, their exact location and how much they cost.

Assistant Village Manager Jon Sfondilis is working to answer those questions so the village can put to use the cemetery it spends roughly \$8,000 a year to maintain in working condition. "It's an active project, but I can't say when it will be completed," he said.

The cemetery, south of Dundee Road and just east of Wolf Road, was

established in the 1800s and marble markers from the early 1840s are still visible.

Village Manager J. Mark Rooney told trustees at a recent workshop that although Wheeling took over care and operation of the cemetery in 1976, it has never sold a plot there.

Estimates on available plots range from 12 to 40, although some of those may belong to families who plan to use them, officials said.

"Our concern is that there may be burials not marked," Sfondilis said.

The cemetery was run by the Wheeling Cemetery Association until 1976, when the cemetery and about \$10,000 in association funds were transferred to the village. Local funeral home owner Louis Kolssak II has been involved in the cemetery on an informal basis but says the village has all the records.

"I turned everything over to them," Kolssak said. "We've had

one burial [there] in the last four or five years."

Kolssak said the records show who is buried there and where; the village isn't sure those records are complete and is working to update them, officials said.

Wheeling is not the only town in the cemetery business. "We have two we took over," said Paul Risinger, general operations superintendent for neighboring Northbrook. Risinger said the village took over the North Northfield Cemetery in 2004 and the Northfield Union Cemetery in 2006. "Both date back to the 1830s," he said.

In Wheeling, a number of former village residents and family members of some of those buried in the cemetery have called with information, Sfondilis said. He's hopeful more people with information about plots come forward to help sort out things out.

Two copies of the Annual Statement of Care Funds are enclosed for your completion. An original copy when completed and notarized should be submitted to this Office within two and one-half months of the end of your fiscal year. The other completed copy should be retained for your files.

The only significant change in the annual report form is the Summary of Income from Care Fund Investments and Expenditures for Care at the bottom of page 2. In previous years the annual statement included a Report of Income from Care Fund Investments Held in Trust at the bottom of the same page. There was much confusion over this section of the report and it was frequently incomplete when received by this Office.

In response to a request of mine, Attorney General Scott rendered an Opinion to this Office on July 22, 1975, advising me that we should require a reporting of the ultimate use of the income of a cemetery care fund, in fulfilling Section 12(d) of the Cemetery Care Act. Section 4 of the Act provides that "care should be furnished only insofar as the net income derived from the amount so deposited in trust." However, this Office recognizes that many cemeteries supplement care fund income with income from their operations to provide better care and maintenance. Therefore, we are requesting total expenditures for care and maintenance (Sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Act) of the cemetery be reported on page 2, line 2B of the report.

On line A of this section of the report, you should continue to report the total income earned on care fund investments as also reported on page 5, column 9. This fulfills Section 12(c) of the Cemetery Care Act.

The Summary of Income from Care Fund Investments and Expenditures for Care will also be subject to audit by our field auditors during their periodic examination of care funds throughout the State. The certification at the bottom of page 1 of the annual report has also been revised to specifically recognize each licensee's responsibility to see that care fund income is spent for care purposes in accordance with the Cemetery Care Act.

As in prior years, I remind you that the Cemetery Care Division of my Office is available to answer your questions regarding the Cemetery Care Act or the Annual Statement of Care Funds. The Springfield Office is located at 208 W. Cook St., phone (217) 782-2051, and the Chicago Office is located at Room 531, 160 N. LaSalle Street, phone (312) 793-2451.

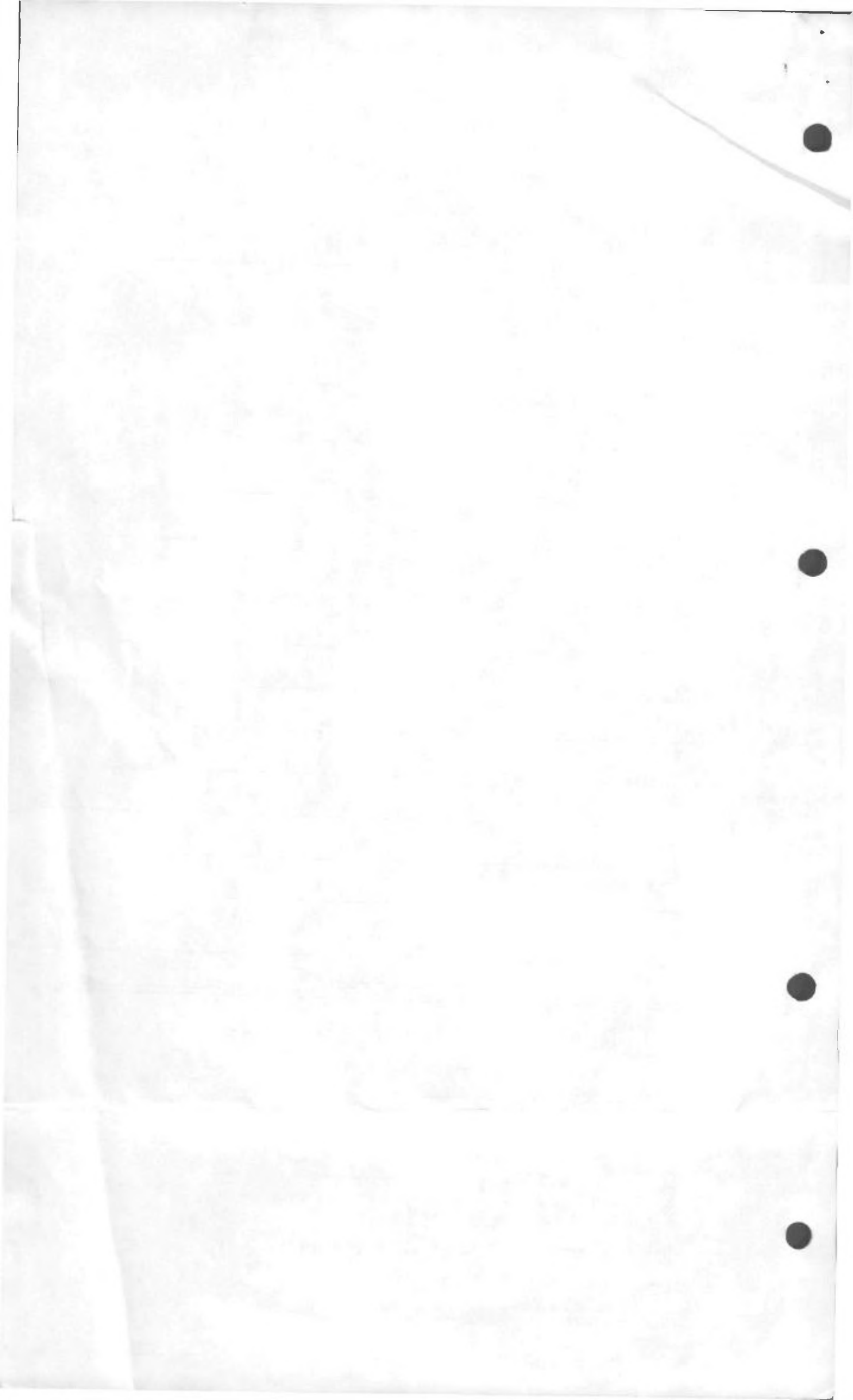

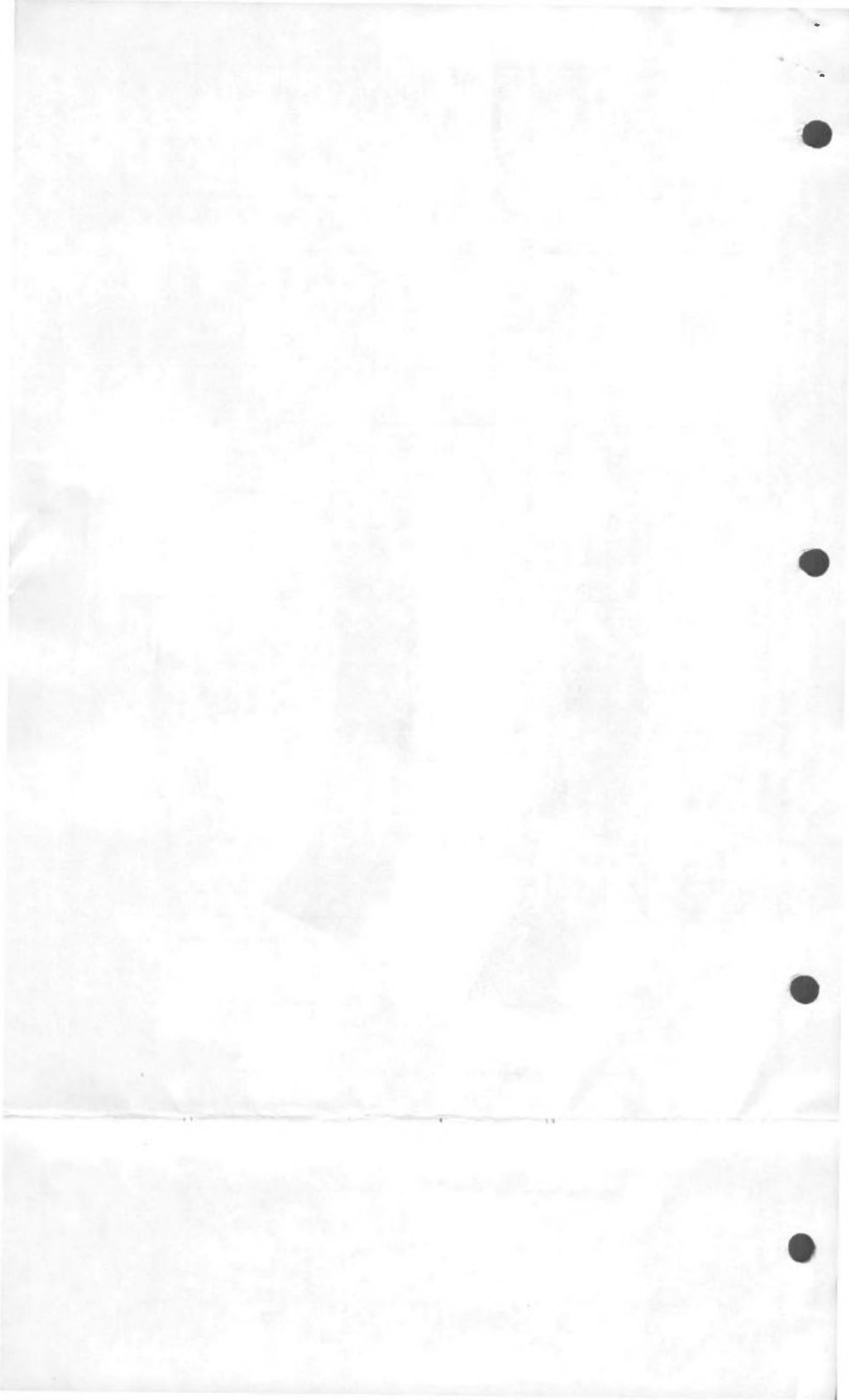

Two centuries of dead rest at site

For centuries, inhabitants of the Des Plaines River area came to the high mound of earth to bury their dead.

It began with the Pottawattomi Indian tribe that camped along the banks of the river in the 1700s. It continues today with Wheeling village residents, who continue to use the Wheeling Cemetery.

The 2-acre cemetery, located on the

south side of Dundee Road east of Wolf Road, is surrounded by the bustle of modern day life. Many village residents drive by it daily without realizing its historical significance.

Merle Willis, former Wheeling Historical Society president, said the recorded history of the cemetery dates back to the early 1800s.

"The earliest stone we've uncovered is 1839. The township wasn't even or-

ganized until 1850," he said.

VILLAGE HISTORIANS believe the ground first was used for burial by Indians living in the area. Willis said people have found bones and arrowheads in the area "but no one knows for sure."

"It was mostly marsh area around here and the cemetery was the highest part. We assume it was an Indian burying ground," he said.

The land was originally purchased

for \$50 in 1850 when the Wheeling Cemetery Assn. was formed. Willis said the graves of many of Wheeling's earliest residents can be found there.

"Most of the verse on the early stones is in German," he said, noting that the first residents of Wheeling were German immigrants.

A listing of those buried in the cemetery is like a review of Wheeling's history — George Strong, who first staked out a piece of land when the settlement opened; George Periolat, owner of the town brewery; and Albert Fassbender, owner of the first store in the village.

THE CEMETERY also tells stories of personal tragedies, Willis said.

"We had one whole family buried here in the early nays — a father mother and five children who died of diphtheria," he said.

Veterans from wars dating back to the Civil War also are buried in the cemetery, Willis said.

Interest in the cemetery has been renewed by the village's decision to assume ownership of the property. The village board tonight is expected to approve an ordinance transferring the deed to the village.

"The sites have been selling like crazy. We've even sold them to people in the condominiums. There's been quite a revival of thought about use of the cemetery," Willis said.

Time, developments bury old cemeteries

When Ernst Weseman's family buried the German pioneer's remains in the middle of a Palatine farm in 1910, they carefully inscribed the brown marble headstone with the words, "Rest in Peace."

If they only knew...

Today, thousands of cars whiz by Weseman's ivy-covered grave each day, occasionally stopping at one of the two fast-food restaurants across the street.

His burial plot is surrounded by a parking lot that services the paint store, wallpaper shop, drugstore, liquor store, pizza place and eight other shops that pack the Plum Grove shopping center directly behind Weseman's tombstone.

To the left and right of the grave are gas stations, one of which covers a tiny cemetery just like the one where Weseman's tomb lies.

Suburbia finally has caught up with its past

Dozens of tiny, historic cemeteries like the Salem Church Cemetery, where Weseman's grave lies, are scattered throughout the suburbs like a patchwork of the past. They're filled with weathered markers bearing the names of suburbia's pioneers and the German names signifying the next wave of suburban settlers.

One-by-one, the plots are being absorbed — and in some cases swallowed entirely — by modern suburban developments.

"There's no question suburban sprawl is menacing these now-forgotten burial grounds," says Palatine resident Avery Wolfrum, one of three members of the Cook County Cemetery Board of Trustees.

Wolfrum, a 56-year-old retiree who calls himself "a professional cemetery hobbyist," says he's dedicating his life to saving such cemeteries. After researching old county documents in 1973, Wolfrum discovered that the county actually owns six such cemeteries in Palatine Twp., Golf, Midlothian, Thornton and Hoffman Estates. He helped form the cemetery commission four years ago to maintain the plots.

"The county government now is struggling with limited federal-grant money to preserve and maintain these cemeteries," Wolfrum says. "They're our only real link with the past — the suburbs' past — and they should be preserved. Unfortunately, we already have lost many of them."

Wolfrum says old maps showed a small cemetery on what is now the busy intersection of Dundee and Sanders Rds. in Northbrook. He recently investigated it and found a modern gas station where the graves were.

"I did some checking around, and one old-timer told me that the gravestones were all knocked down in the 1920s

when a previous gas station went in," Wolfrum says. "But when they went to dig the foundation for the station, they kept hitting all these corpses. It was a real horror story."

Despite concern by local preservation societies, Wolfrum claims most of the small cemeteries face an uphill battle against suburbia's development wave.

The Cook County Cemetery Board has relied entirely on infrequent federal Community Development Block Grants for the \$60,000 to \$70,000 it has spent fencing off the plots, clearing the underbrush and cutting the lawns, Wolfrum says.

"The problem is the families that started these cemetery plots now are the ones who are in them," Wolfrum says. "There's no one to carry them on. The land has been sold in trusts to developers and there's little anyone can do to keep the bulldozers out."

"But I think there is some hope," he says. "Cemeteries always have been sacred burial grounds. It's hard to imagine too many people being able to face the thought of digging up a sacred shrine for the basement of an apartment building."

ORDINANCE NO. 1409

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees deem it in the best interests of the citizens of the Village of Wheeling that the Village acquire and preserve the property commonly known as the Wheeling Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, the Wheeling Cemetery Association has agreed to transfer title to said cemetery in return for the Village's representation that the Cemetery will be maintained and preserved by the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village is specifically authorized by Chapter 24, §11-49-1 of the Illinois Revised Statutes to acquire and maintain said Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, the Village is specifically authorized by Chapter 24, §11-48.2-2 of the Illinois Revised Statutes to declare said Cemetery as an official landmark of the Village of Wheeling;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Wheeling, County of Cook, State of Illinois as follows:

SECTION A.

That the President and Clerk of the Village of Wheeling are hereby directed and authorized to accept on behalf of the Village the deed to the property commonly known as the Wheeling Cemetery and to record the same with the Registrar of Titles, County of Cook, State of Illinois.

SECTION B.

That the ^{Treasurer} ~~Assistant Village Manager~~ is hereby directed and authorized to accept all assets of the Wheeling Cemetery Association and deposit same in a Cemetery Association Fund; all future incomes from said Cemetery shall be deposited in said Fund.

SECTION C.

That pursuant to Chapter 24, §11-48.2-2 of the Illinois Revised Statutes the Wheeling Cemetery is declared an official landmark of the Village of Wheeling and shall be regulated as such by the corporate authorities of the Village of Wheeling.

SECTION D.

The invalidity of any section or provision of this Ordinance hereby adopted shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

SECTION E.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

Wheeling to take over care of historic cemetery

8-20-75

Steps toward purchasing the historic Wheeling Cemetery were authorized Monday by the village board.

Board members requested that Village Atty. John Burke prepare the necessary documents for the village to purchase the cemetery, at Pine Street and Dundee Road, and take over its operation on Jan. 1.

The board's action was in response to a request by members of the Wheeling Cemetery Association, a nonprofit group that has been overseeing the cemetery's operation.

The village will purchase the cemetery for \$1 and, in addition to the 1.7-acre site, will receive approximately \$4,500 worth of stocks and bonds invested by the cemetery directors for perpetual care.

The directors met earlier with the village board's real estate and zoning committee. Adeline Schneider, 133 N. Milwaukee, told board members that there are graves in the cemetery dating back to 1832.

"The first settlers of this village are buried there, among them 18 Civil War veterans and the first three country doctors who served the village. The board of directors' concern is that now that we are all getting older, someone must continue to care for the cemetery.

"Who's going to do this after I'm gone? We need the assurance that someone will continue to care for the gravesites. It's not that much work, I've done it for 40 years, but now for an old lady like me to go up there with a grave digger and have to walk off a grave site in a foot of snow is impossible. I just can't do it anymore," Schneider said. She is 84 years old.

Merle Willis, 60 N. Wolf, president of the association's board of directors, told the village board that there are approximately 37 unpurchased gravesites. The board agreed to permit the association to sell sites through Dec. 31. No sites would be sold after that, village board members said.

Board member Gilbert Monoson, chairman of the real estate and zoning committee, said the takeover would cost village residents nothing, and that the bonds and stocks could pay for the maintenance of the cemetery for several years.

Monoson said the village would contact state and federal agencies in an effort to obtain grants for the construction of a fence around the cemetery. The fence would be necessary to prevent vandalism of grave markers, he said.

11-52-1. Control and vacation.] § 11-52-1. Public graveyards, not under the control of any corporation, sole, organization or society, and located within the limits of cities, villages, or incorporated towns, shall and may be controlled or vacated by the corporate authorities of such city, village, or incorporated town in such manner as such authorities deem proper.

11-52-2. Conveyances to municipality—Acceptance.] § 11-52-2. The corporate authorities of any city, village or incorporated town may accept a conveyance from any person, corporation, association or society of any property within the limits of the city, village or incorporated town, or within one mile of the corporate limits of the city, village or incorporated town, which has been or is used as a public graveyard or burial ground. After the acceptance of any such conveyance the property conveyed shall be under the control, management, maintenance and ownership of the city, village or incorporated town.

11-52.1-1 Establishment—Sale of lots.] § 11-52.1-1 Any city or village may establish and maintain cemeteries, within and without its corporate limits, and acquire lands therefor, by condemnation or otherwise, and may lay out lots of convenient size for families, and may sell lots for family burying ground, or to individuals for burial purposes. Added by act approved May 2, 1963. L.1963, p. 832.

11-52.1-2 Board of managers—Donations.] § 11-52.1-2 Any city or village owning or controlling a municipal cemetery lying within or without, or partly within or without, the corporate limits of such city or village, shall have the power to appoint by the mayor or president, with the advice and consent of the city council or board of trustees, a board of 3 persons who shall be known as the cemetery board of managers. Such managers shall hold their office for a period of 2 years or until their successors are appointed. Such board of managers may receive in trust from the proprietors or owners of any lot in the cemetery, or any person interested in the maintenance of the cemetery, any gift, devise or bequest of any money or property, either real, personal or mixed, which

may be donated to the board of managers for the use and maintenance of the lot or cemetery. The board of managers may convert property donated into money and invest the same in such manner as shall be provided by ordinance of the city or village and apply the income therefrom perpetually for the care of the cemetery lot or the care and maintenance of the cemetery, as shall be specified in the gift, bequest or devise, and as may be provided by ordinance of the city or village.

Every gift, bequest or devise, for any of the purposes mentioned in this section, made to a cemetery by its name, it having a board of managers, appointed as provided herein, shall vest in such board of managers and take effect to all intents and purposes as if made to such board, and shall not fail merely because such cemetery is not incorporated.

The board of managers shall, as soon as may be convenient after appointment, meet and organize by selecting one of their number to be president and another of their number to be clerk of such board, and also to select a treasurer of such board, who may or may not be one of their number. The treasurer before entering upon his duties as such, shall execute a bond to the People of the State of Illinois for the use of the board of managers, in a penal sum not less than double the value of the money or property coming into his hands as such treasurer, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties and for the faithful accounting for all property which, by virtue of his office, comes into his hands. The bond shall be in such form and with such sureties as may be approved by the city council or board of trustees appointing the board of managers, to be approved and preserved in the same manner as is the bond of the treasurer of such city or village.

The board treasurer shall have the custody of all money and property received in trust by the board of managers, and shall pay out the same only upon the written order of the board, signed by at least 2 of them, and he shall keep permanent books of record of all such trust funds and of all receipts and disbursements thereof, and for what purposes received and disbursed. The treasurer shall annually make a report in writing to the board of managers, under oath, showing balances, receipts and disbursements, including a statement showing the amount and principal of trust funds on hand and how invested. This report shall be audited by the board, and if found correct, shall be transmitted to the city council or board of trustees, at the same time that the treasurer of the city or village is required by law to make his report, and shall be approved and preserved in the same manner, if found to be correct.

The clerk of the board of managers, in a book provided for such purpose, shall keep a permanent record of the proceedings of the board, signed by the president and attested by the clerk, and shall also keep a permanent record of the several trust funds, from what sources received, the amounts thereof, and for what uses and purposes, respectively. The clerk shall annually, at the time of transmitting the treasurer's report to the city council or board of trustees, make a report in writing, under oath, to the city council or board of trustees, stating therein, substantially the same matter required to be reported by the treasurer of the board. The clerk's report, if found to be correct, shall be approved and preserved by the city council or board of trustees. The city council or board of trustees shall have the power to remove from office any or

11-52.1-4 Donations for purpose of maintenance—Appointment of corporate trustee—Investments.] § 11-52.1-4 Whenever any money or other property has been or may hereafter be given, devised or bequeathed to the board of managers of any municipal cemetery owned or controlled by any city or village for the purpose of maintaining any lot in the cemetery, or for the purpose of maintaining the cemetery, as provided in this Division 52.1, the municipal authorities may by ordinance provide for the appointment of any corporation authorized to do trust business as trustee of such money or property, in place of the treasurer of the board of managers. The corporate trustee so appointed shall have the same powers, authority and duties with regard to the administration of the trust funds as are provided herein for the treasurer of the board of managers except that it shall not be required to execute a bond and may charge for its services as trustee such amounts as may be agreed upon from time to time with the municipal authorities. The corporate trustee so appointed shall have the power to invest the trust funds in any investment authorized by the law of Illinois as proper fiduciary investments. The trustee, however, may retain any property given, devised or bequeathed to it in trust even though such property may not be a legal investment under the laws of Illinois.

The board of managers may from time to time establish the minimum amount which will be received by gift, devise or bequest for the use and maintenance of any lot in the cemetery, subject to the approval by the municipal authorities. Added by act approved May 2, 1963. L.1963, p. 832.

11-52.2-1 Board of managers—Donations.] § 11-52.2-1 If the city council or board of trustees of any city, incorporated town or village, having the management and control of any public graveyard or public cemetery, elects to receive and hold money, funds and property in perpetual trust pursuant to the provisions of this Division 52.2, it shall provide by ordinance for the appointment of a board of managers, of such public graveyard or cemetery, and prescribe the duties, and the term

erty in perpetual trust pursuant to the provisions of this act. Such election shall be evidenced by a by-law or resolution adopted by the board of directors, or board of trustees of the incorporated cemetery association. Any person is authorized to give, donate, devise or bequeath any sum of money or any funds, securities, or property of any kind to the cemetery association, in perpetual trust, for the maintenance, care, repair, upkeep or ornamentation of the cemetery, or any lot or lots, or grave or graves in the cemetery, specified in the instrument making the gift, donation, devise or bequest. The cemetery association may receive and hold in perpetual trust, any such money, funds, securities and property so given, donated, devised or bequeathed to it, and may convert the property, funds and securities into money and shall invest and keep invested the proceeds thereof and the money so given, donated and bequeathed, in safe and secure income bearing investments, including investments in income producing real estate, provided the purchase price of the real estate shall not exceed the fair market value thereof on the date of its purchase as such value is determined by the board of directors or board of trustees of the association. The principal of the trust fund shall be kept intact and the income arising therefrom shall be perpetually applied for the uses and purposes specified in the instrument making the gift, donation, devise or bequest and for no other purpose.

The by-laws of the cemetery association shall provide for a permanent committee to manage and control the trust funds so given, donated, devised and bequeathed to it. The members of the committee shall be appointed by the board of directors, or board of trustees of the cemetery association from among the members of the board of directors or board of trustees. The committee shall choose a chairman, a secretary and a treasurer from among the members, and shall have the management and control of the trust funds of the cemetery association so given, donated, devised and bequeathed in trust, under the supervision of the board of directors or board of trustees. The treasurer of the committee shall execute a bond to the People of the State of Illinois for the use of the cemetery association, in a penal sum of not less than double the amount of the trust funds coming into his hands as treasurer, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties and the faithful accounting for all money or funds which by virtue of his treasurership come into his hands, and be in such form and with such securities as may be prescribed and approved by the board of directors, or board of trustees, and shall be approved by such board of directors, or board of trustees, and filed with the secretary of the cemetery association.

The treasurer of the committee shall have the custody of all money, funds and property received in trust by the cemetery association and shall invest the same in accordance with the directions of the committee as approved by the board of directors or board of trustees of the cemetery association, and shall receive and have the custody of all of the income arising from such investments and as the income is received by him, he shall pay it to the treasurer of the cemetery association, and he shall keep permanent books of record of all such trust funds and of all receipts arising therefrom and disbursements thereof, and shall annually make a report in writing to the board of directors or board of trustees of the cemetery association, under oath, showing receipts and disbursements, including a statement showing the

amount and principal of trust funds on hand and how invested, which report shall be audited by the board of directors, or board of trustees. If found correct, shall be approved, and filed with the secretary of the cemetery association.

The secretary of the committee, in a book provided for such purpose, shall keep a permanent record of the proceedings of the committee, by the president and attested by the secretary. He shall also keep a permanent record of the trust funds, the amounts thereof, and for uses and purposes, respectively and he shall annually, at the time the treasurer makes his report, make a report in writing under oath, to the board of directors or board of trustees, and therein substantially the same matter required to be reported by the treasurer of the committee which report if found to be correct shall be approved, and filed with the secretary of the cemetery association.

The treasurer shall execute a bond to the People of the State of Illinois, in a penal sum less than double the amount of money or funds coming into his hands as such treasurer, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties and the faithful accounting of all money or funds which by virtue of his office come into his hands, and be in such form and with such securities as may be prescribed and approved by the board of directors, or board of trustees, and shall be approved by such board of directors or board of trustees and filed with the secretary of the cemetery association.

The trust funds, gifts, devises and bequests mentioned in this section and the income arising therefrom shall be exempt from taxation and from the operation of all laws of mortmain, and the same shall be exempt against perpetuities and accumulations.

Where the cemetery is a privately operated cemetery, as defined in section 2 of the Cemetery Care Act, enacted by the Sixty-fifth General Assembly,¹ or where the lot or lots or graves are in a privately operated cemetery defined in section 2 of that Act, then such cemetery association or such committee, shall also comply with the provisions of the Cemetery Care Act, enacted by the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, as amended by act approved July 21, 1947, P. S. 1947, p. 350.

CEMETERY CARE ACT

AN ACT to regulate the care funds of cemeteries and of lots, graves, crypts, niches, private mausoleums, memorials, markers, or monuments in cemeteries. Approved July 21, 1947, L. 1947, p. 338. Effective Jan. 1, 1948.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

64.1 Short title.] § 1. This Act shall be known as the "Cemetery Care Act."

64.2 § 2. Definitions.) The following words, terms and phrases used in this Act, for the purpose of this Act, have the following meanings:

"Comptroller" means the Comptroller of the State of Illinois.

"Care" means the maintenance of a cemetery of the lots, graves, crypts, niches, family mausoleums, memorials, and markers therein; including cutting and trimming of lawn, shrubs and trees at reasonable intervals; keeping in repair the drainage

By the People of the State of Illinois, in General Assembly:

Restoration of neglected cemeteries by referendum.] § 1. Any county may restore neglected cemeteries and the proceeds thereof may, in the manner and manner provided, levy a tax annually thereon regardless of whether or not such cemetery is owned or controlled by the county.

Amount of tax.] § 2. This act shall be effective in any county unless the proposition of its adoption is submitted to the voters of the county at any regular election or a special election called for such purpose and a majority of the votes cast at such election in favor of its adoption.

Petition signed by 100 legal voters of the county presented to the county board for the submission of a proposition whether the county should recondition and restore neglected cemeteries, the county board shall call for the submission of the proposition at the next general election held in the county or at a special election duly called for such

adoption of such resolution and the proposition shall be submitted to the voters of the county at the next general election held in such county or in case the county board fails to call for the submission thereof at a special election duly called for such purpose. The officers charged with the counting and canvassing of the votes thereon shall do all acts necessary for the proposition to be properly submitted to the voters of the county and a proper result of the submission to be made in accordance with the law in similar cases. The ballot to be used in voting upon the proposition shall be in substantially the following form:

Such tax shall be in addition to other taxes authorized by law to be levied and collected in the county and shall not

be included within any limitation of rate of taxes for county purposes as now or hereafter provided by law but shall be excluded therefrom and in addition thereto. The foregoing limitations upon tax rates, insofar as they are applicable to counties of less than 1,000,000 population, may be increased or decreased under the referendum provisions of the General Revenue Law of Illinois.¹ Amended by P.A. 77-846, § 1, eff. 62c. Cemetery fund.] § 3. The proceeds of such tax when collected shall be paid into the county treasury in a fund to be known as the cemetery fund and shall be expended for the purpose of reconditioning and restoring neglected cemeteries in such manner as may be prescribed by the board of county commissioners.

62d. Discontinuing restoration—Referendum.] § 4. Upon a petition signed by not less than one hundred (100) voters of a county which has adopted the provisions of this Act,¹ requesting that a proposition to discontinue the restoring and reconditioning of neglected cemeteries by the county be submitted to the voters of the county, being presented to the county board, the county board shall adopt a resolution providing for the submission of the proposition to the voters of the county in a similar manner as is hereinabove provided for the adoption of the provisions of this Act. If a majority of the voters of the county, voting upon the proposition are in favor thereof the proposition shall be deemed adopted and the reconditioning and restoring of neglected cemeteries and the levy of a tax therefor shall be discontinued in the county. If any moneys remain in the cemetery fund after such tax has been discontinued and no outstanding indebtedness against such fund exists, the remaining moneys shall be paid into the general fund for county purposes in the county treasury.

PERPETUAL TRUSTS

AN ACT in regard to Cemeteries and to Authorize Perpetual Trusts for the Repair, Maintenance, Up-keep and Ornamentation of Cemeteries and Lots and Graves in Cemeteries and to provide for the management of such trusts. [Approved July 8, 1927, L. 1927, p. 191.]

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

63. § 1. Repealed by act approved May 2, 1963. L.1963, p. 827.

64. Perpetual trust to cemetery association.] § 2. Any incorporated cemetery association incorporated not for pecuniary profit, may if it elects to do so, receive and hold money, funds and prop-

plat of the survey to be made and recorded in the recorder's office of the proper county, and may also sell and make deeds of conveyance of any lots, or parts of lots, for family or individual use for burials, at such price and such terms as they may think best, to create a fund to keep the grounds in good repair, and purchase, where necessary, additional grounds thereto, and any sale so made shall vest the purchaser, or his legal representatives, with the right to make any improvements on the parts so purchased, as he may desire, subject to any general rules or regulations of the trustees. The trustees shall also have the right to decide and direct the depth all graves shall be dug, and to set apart any portion of the grounds for the burial of paupers.

26. Acts of former trustees validated.] § 5. Where any county board has heretofore appointed trustees to take charge of county cemetery grounds, and such trustees have performed any acts by virtue of their appointment, which would not be inconsistent with the provisions of this law, such acts are hereby legalized, and the treasurer and trustees so appointed shall be hereafter subject and governed by the provisions of this act.

27. County board may remove.] § 6. The county board shall have the power to remove from office any trustee appointed by it, and to fill all vacancies which may in any way occur.

28. Compensation.] § 7. The compensation of the trustees and treasurer mentioned in the foregoing sections of this act shall be fixed by the board of supervisors in counties under township organization, and by the county commissioners in counties not under township organization, of the respective counties.

OWNERSHIP AND TRANSFER OF LANDS

AN ACT in relation to cemeteries. [Filed May 27, 1891. L. 1891, p. 36.]

29. Extent of ownership.] § 1. *Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:* That all cemetery associations, or companies incorporated for cemetery purposes, by any general or special law of this State may acquire by purchase, gift or devise, and may hold, own and convey for burial purposes only, so much land as may be necessary for use as a cemetery or burial place for the dead. [As amended by act approved and in force April 3, 1895. L. 1895, p. 81.]

30. Conveyance to city, etc.] § 1a. Any such association or company may, if it so desires, convey property which it may hold within a city, village, incorporated town, county not under township organization or town, to the city, village, incorporated town, county, or town within which the property is located, and if the city, village, incorporated town, county or town accepts the conveyance such property shall thereafter be under the control, management, and ownership of the city, village, incorporated town, county or town. [Added by act filed July 13, 1921. L. 1921, p. 160.]

AN ACT in relation to the conveyance, use and preservation of burial lots in cemeteries. [Approved April 21, 1899. In force July 1. L. 1899, p. 85.]

31. Lot in perpetual trust, etc.] § 1. *Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:* That any

burial lot in any cemetery controlled by any company or association incorporated for cemetery purposes under any general or special law of the State of Illinois, may, by the owner or owners, be conveyed or devised back to and held by such company or association in perpetual trust for the purpose of its preservation as a place of burial, and shall thereafter remain forever inalienable by act of the parties, but the right to use the same as a place of burial of the dead of the family of the owner and his descendants shall descend from generation to generation unless the deed of conveyance in trust shall provide that interments in such lot shall be confined to the bodies of specified persons, in which case such lot shall be forever preserved as the burial place of the persons specified in the deed and shall never be used for any other purpose whatever: Provided, however, that in all cases where in addition to the cemetery corporation there is a special corporation or board of trustees created for the purpose of taking and preserving an improvement or funds for the respective cemetery, then and in such cases such conveyances in trust of burial lots to be held in perpetuity may be made to and held by such special corporation or board of trustees, upon the same trust, provisions and conditions as are above provided in case of conveyances to cemetery companies: Provided, further, however, that no conveyance in trust authorized by this act shall be made without the consent of the cemetery company or association in whose cemetery such burial lot is located.

32. Donations in trust in perpetuity for permanent improvement, etc., of burial lot.] § 2. That every such company or association incorporated for cemetery purposes under any general or special law of the State of Illinois may receive, by gift, devise, bequest, or otherwise, moneys or real or personal property, or the income or avails of such moneys or property, in trust, in perpetuity, for the improvement, maintenance, ornamentation, repair, care and preservation of any burial lot or grave, vault, tomb, or other such structures, in any cemetery owned or controlled by such cemetery company or association, upon such terms and in such manner as may be provided by the terms of such gift, devise, bequest, or other conveyance of such moneys or property in trust and assented to by such company or association, and subject to the rules and regulations of such company or association, and every such company or association owning or controlling any such cemetery may make contracts with the owner or owners or legal representatives of any lot, grave, vault, tomb, or other such structure in such cemetery, for the improvement, maintenance, ornamentation, care, preservation and repair of any such lot, grave, vault, tomb, or other such structure in such cemetery owned or controlled by such cemetery company or association; provided, however, that where the cemetery is a privately operated cemetery, as defined in section 2 of the Cemetery Care Act, enacted by the Sixty-fifth General Assembly¹ or where the burial lot or grave, vault, tomb, or other such structures are in a privately operated cemetery, as defined in section 2 of that Act, then such company or association shall also comply with the provisions of the Cemetery Care Act, enacted by the Sixty-fifth General Assembly.² As amended by act approved July 21, 1947. L. 1947, p. 336.

water lines, roads, buildings, fences and other structures, in keeping with a well maintained cemetery; also overhead expense necessary for such purposes, including maintenance of machinery, tools and equipment for such care; compensation of employees, payment of insurance premiums, reasonable payments for employees pension and other benefit plans, and maintaining necessary records of lot ownership, transfers and burials.

"Care funds" as distinguished from receipts from annual charges or gifts for current or annual care, means any realty or personalty impressed with a trust by the terms of any gift, grant, contribution, payment, devise or bequest, or pursuant to contract, accepted by any cemetery authority owning, operating, controlling or managing a privately operated cemetery, or by any trustee or licensee, agent or custodian for the same, under Section 3 of this Act,¹ and the amounts set aside under Section 4 of this Act,² and any income accumulated therefrom, where legally so directed by the terms of the transaction by which the principal was established.

"Cemetery" means any land or structure in this State dedicated to and used, or intended to be used, for the interment of human remains.

"Cemetery authority" means any person, firm, corporation, trustee, partnership, association or municipality owning, operating, controlling or managing a cemetery or holding lands for burial grounds or burial purposes in this State.

"Crypt" means a space in a mausoleum used or intended to be used, above or under ground, to entomb human remains.

"Family burying ground" means a cemetery in which no lots are sold to the public and in which interments are restricted to a group of persons related to each other by blood or marriage.

"Fraternal cemetery" means a cemetery owned, operated, controlled, or managed by any fraternal organization or auxiliary organizations thereof, in which the sale of lots, graves, crypts or niches is restricted principally to its members.

"Grave" means a space of ground in a cemetery, used, or intended to be used, for burial.

"Investment Company Act of 1940" means Title 15, United States Code Annotated, Sections 80a-1 to 80a-51, inclusive, as now or hereafter amended.³

"Investment Company" means any issuer (a) whose securities are purchasable only with care funds or trust funds, or both; and (b) which is an open and diversified management company as defined in and registered under the "Investment Company Act of 1940"; and (c) which has entered into an agreement with the Comptroller containing such provisions as the Comptroller by regulation reasonably requires for the proper administration of this Act.

"Municipal cemetery" means a cemetery owned, operated, controlled or managed by any city, village, incorporated town, township, county, or other municipal corporation, political subdivision, or instrumentality thereof authorized by law to own, operate, or manage a cemetery.

"Niche" means a space in a columbarium used or intended to be used, for inurnment of cremated human remains.

"Privately operated cemetery" means any cemetery other than a fraternal, municipal or religious cemetery or a family burying ground.

"Religious cemetery" means a cemetery owned, operated, controlled, or managed by any recognized church, religious society, association or denomination, or by any cemetery authority or any corporation administering, or through which is adminis-

tered, the temporalities of any recognized church, religious society, association or denomination.

64.3 § 3. Gifts and contributions—Trust funds.) Any cemetery authority is hereby authorized and empowered to accept any gift, grant, contribution, payment, devise or bequest, or pursuant to contract, any sum of money, funds, securities or property of any kind, or the income or avails thereof, and to hold the same in trust in perpetuity for the care of its cemetery, or for the care of any lot, grave, crypt or niche in its cemetery; or for the special care of any lot, grave, crypt or niche or of any family mausoleum or memorial, marker, or monument in its cemetery. No gift, grant, devise, bequest, payment or other contribution shall be invalid by reason of any indefiniteness or uncertainty as to the beneficiary designated in the instrument creating the gift, grant, devise, bequest, payment or other contribution. If any gift, grant, devise, bequest, payment or other contribution consists of non-income producing property, the cemetery authority accepting it is authorized and empowered to sell such property and to invest the funds obtained in accordance with the provisions of the next succeeding paragraph.

The carefunds authorized by this Section and provided for in Section 4 of this Act shall be held intact and, unless otherwise restricted by the terms of the gift, grant, devise, bequest, contribution, payment, contract or other payment, as to investments made after June 11, 1951 the cemetery authority or the trustee of the care funds of the cemetery authority, in acquiring, investing, reinvesting, exchanging, retaining, selling and managing property for any such trust, shall exercise the judgment and care under the circumstances then prevailing, which men of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not in regard to speculation but in regard to the permanent disposition of their funds, considering the probable income as well as the probable safety of their capital. Within the limitations of the foregoing standard, the cemetery authority or the trustee of the care funds of the cemetery authority is authorized to acquire and retain every kind of property, real, personal or mixed, and every kind of investment, including specifically but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, bonds, debentures and other corporate obligations, stocks, preferred or common and real estate mortgages, which men of prudence, discretion and intelligence acquire or retain for their own account. Within the limitations of the foregoing standard, such authority or trustee is authorized to retain property properly acquired, without limitation as to time and without regard to its suitability for original purchase. The care funds authorized by this Section may be commingled with other trust funds received by such cemetery authority for the care of its cemetery or for the care or special care of any lot, grave, crypt, niche, private mausoleum, memorial, marker, or monument in its cemetery, whether received by gift, grant, devise, bequest, contribution, payment, contract or other conveyance heretofore or hereafter made to such cemetery authority. Such care funds may be invested with common trust funds as provided in "The Common Trust Fund Act", approved June 24, 1949.² The net income only from the investment of such care funds shall be allocated and used for the purposes specified in the transaction by which the principal was established in the

§ 2. Every person, firm or corporation owning or controlling any cemetery or burial place in this State shall by itself, his or its superintendent or agent, keep a permanent separate record of the burial of each and every United States War Veteran, such record to contain the name of the veteran, date of death, the war, his rank and organization served in, dates of enlistment and discharge, with location of grave in cemetery and shall report such information to the Administrator of the Illinois Veterans' Commission when requested. The Administrator shall, upon application, furnish blank forms indicating the form and content of the report to be made and filed as herein provided.

~~For filing and recording such report, the Administrator may charge a fee of \$1.00 per report. The fee shall be paid by the person, firm or corporation owning or controlling the cemetery.~~

Any person, firm or corporation owning or controlling a cemetery or burial place, who fails to make and file such report within 30 days after receipt of such request is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$100. It is the duty of the State's attorney in the county where the cemetery or burial place is located to enforce the provisions of this Act. [Amended by Act approved July 6, 1953.]

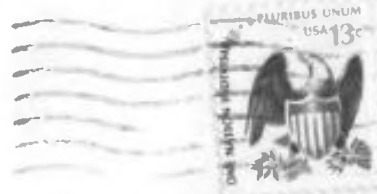
