PLEAS before the Honorable FRANK SCALES, sole presiding Judge of the County Court of Cook County, in the State of Illinois, at a regular term of said County Court of Cook County, begun and holden at the Court House, in the City of Chicago, in said County and State, on the second Monday, being the *9th* day of *July* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety *four* and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and *nineteenth*.

Be it remembered that heretofore, to wit: on the *Seventeenth* day of *July* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety *four* the same being one of the days of the *July* Term of the County Court of Cook County, the following among other proceedings were had and entered of record in said Court, to wit:

Now, on this day, the matter of the canvassing of the votes for and against organization under the General Law, in the proposed Village of Wheeling, coming on to be heard, and the Honorable Frank Scales, County Judge of the County of Cook and State of Illinois, and Lewis B. Scharringhausen, and Donald C. McShannon, two Justices of the Peace of the County of Cook, having before them the

returns of a special election, to determine for or against the organization of said Village, under the General Law; and it appearing to said Judge, and to said Justices of the Peace that said election was held upon due notice, on June 19th, 1894, and in accordance with the order of the County Court of Cook County, in that behalf heretofore entered, they proceeded to canvass the returns of said election, and thereupon found that there were forty-six (46) votes cast at said election, that forty-three (43) of said votes were for Village organization under the General Law, and three (3) of said votes were against Village Organization under the General Law, and it thus appearing that a majority of said votes were in favor of the organization of the Village of Wheeling under the General Law, it is found adjudged and decreed by the Court, that said Village of Wheeling, with the boundaries mentioned in the petition heretofore filed in this Court, is duly organized under the General Law of the State of Illinois relating to the organization of cities, villages and towns; and that the boundaries of said village are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the middle of the Des Plaines River on the line between the north and South halves of Section twelve (12) Township forty-two (42), North, Range eleven (11) East of the third principal meridian in the Township

of Wheeling, Cook County, Illinois; thence running West on said half-section line to a point seven hundred sixteen and $\frac{4}{10}$ (716.4) feet west of the east line of Section ten (10) in said Township; thence North along the west line of a subdivision known as Huntersville to the center of the Dundee road, in the west half of Section two (2) in said township, thence easterly in the center of the Dundee road to a point about five hundred twenty-five (525) feet west of the line between the east and west halves of Section two (2); said point being the southwest corner of land now owned by Jacob Volz; thence northerly along the west line of said Volz's land to the northwest corner of said Volz's land on the south line of Lot seven (7) of George Strong's Subdivision in the west half of Section two (2); thence east along said line to the east line of the west half of said Section two (2); thence north along the said half-section line to the northwest corner of lot three (3) in the subdivision of Gerfaluus Nechninger's farm; thence East on the north line of said Lot three (3) to the middle of the Des Plaines River; thence southerly along the middle of said river, to the place of beginning, containing seven hundred seventy-five (775) acres of land, more or less.

It is therefore further ordered by the Court that an election be held in said Village of Wheeling on Tuesday, the 17th day of July, A.D. 1894, at Union Hall, in said Village of Wheeling for the purpose of electing the following

election officers, to-wit.

One President of the Village of Wheeling;
Six Trustees of the Village of Wheeling;
One Clerk of the Village of Wheeling;
One Police Magistrate of the Village of Wheeling;
That the poles of said election be opened and closed,
and said election conducted according to the
General Election Law of the State of Illinois;
that John George Schneider, Henry Bohmer
and Robert Perolat are hereby appointed
Judges of said election, and Louis Fischer
and Christian Wendling are appointed clerks
of said election; that all nominations for said
offices, made according to law, shall be
reported to the County Clerk of the County
of Cook, who shall prepare the official
ballots, and distribute the same, in accordance
with the Statute in such case made and
provided, and that said clerk give notice
of said election by causing notices thereof
to be posted in said Village of Wheeling, in
five public places at least 15 days before
said election

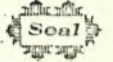
