**German Potato Salad**

- 10 potatoes
- 1 Onion
- 1/2 tsp dry mustard
- 1/2 cup water
- 6 bacon strips
- 1 T Corn Starch
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup vinegar

Boil potatoes, peel and dice and put into bowl. Brown the bacon strips till crisp and put on the side. Cut onion, according to taste and put into bacon fat and brown. Add all together in a cup the corn starch, dry

mustard, sugar, water and vinegar and stir. Add to the onion with the bacon fat and boil and stir. Add to the potatoes, take bacon strips and crumble into the potatoes and sauce and stir and enjoy.

I do not have the steps but only the ingredients but this is what I do. Give it a try and see what you think of it. If you don't want to use the 10 potatoes make what you want. Really enjoy!!!!
