# Town remembers trustee Donald Welflin

Services will be held Wednesday for former Wheeling trustee Donald E. Welflin, a member of one of Wheeling's first families.

Welflin, 67, served as a trustee from 1949 to 1953, according to his brother Edward C. Welflin, who currently resides in Rolling Meadows. Edward was also a Wheeling trustee a few years later.

Services will begin at 2 p.m. at Kolssak Golden Rule Funeral Home. 189 S. Milwaukee Ave., Wheeling.

Welflin served as a captain in the

U.S. Army during World War II. His father ran a general store in Wheeling, which he opened about 1916. Donald and Edward Welflin took over the store after their father died. and ran it "until the Jewel grocery store opened, then he converted it to a sporting goods store," Edward remembers.

Marshall Balling, first cousin to the Welflins, grew up with Donald and remembers him as a sports enthusiast.

"He played golf, and baseball. I guess he was a pretty good softball player while he was in the Army. He was their star pitcher."

Welflin was married twice. He met his first wife while stationed in New York. They had just one child, John, who is a music teacher in Higginsville. Mo.

Edward Welflin said a favorite family story about his brother involved his Army training, when he was an officer's candidate alongside none other than Clark Gable.

Edward said he and his brother got into politics because "the town was quite small then, and we were an old-time family, so we knew the town." Their grandfather. Chris Welflin, was one of the first settlers

in Wheeling. A harness maker, he came to the United States from the Alsace-Lorraine region in France during the mid-1800's.

Donald Welflin was a widower living in Higginsville with his son when he died last week. He came back up to Chicago last year to attend a class reunion of classmates from the old Arlington High School.

Former Wheeling Mayor A. R. McIntyre said Welflin was a "nice guy. They used to have a carnival in Wheeling every year, it was a big thing here. He had a booth there."














# 4-year-old David Welflin dies suddenly

Word of the death of little David John Welflin, son of Mr. and Mrs. Donald E. Welflin struck the people of Wheeling like a thunderbolt from a clear sky. Saturday David played happily with the children of the neighborhood.

While at the breakfast table Sunday he began feeling ill and soon showed signs of paralysis. Immediately after the arrival of a doctor he was rushed to Billings Memorial hospital in Chicago where the best specialists were put on his case.

After numerous tests the diagnosis was given as a rare blood disease, of which only three previous known cases are on record in Chicago. The blood disturbances caused a toxic condition bringing on a paralysis of the nerves which took his life at 10:30 Sunday evening. The attack was believed to be a recurrence of the disease which first was evident about 21 months ago, but then was thought to have been polio. An autopsy confirmed the doctor's present diagnosis that no polio germs were present.

David John was born in Oakland, California March 30, 1945 and would have been five years old next spring. After Mr. Welflin's release from the Air Force the family returned to Wheeling. Funcral services were held Wednesday morning at St. Mary's church, Buffalo Grove, where the Angels Mass was sung. Burial was made in Ridgewood cemetery next to his great-grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. John Meyer.

Besides his grief-stricken parents and grandparents, David is survived by his 9 month old brother, Donald Mark, and many other relatives and friends.






