

# Old-time residents gather to reminisce

Some of Wheeling's oldest residents got together this weekend to share some food, stories and sing

songs.

About 50 people who have lived in Wheeling for more than 25 years gathered Sunday afternoon at the

Old Settlers Picnic held in Chamber Park.

Most of the people came from Wheeling, but some traveled back to the village to talk about the old times

"It was just a fun time had by all," said Trustee Judy Abruscato, who attended the event.

The Wheeling Historical Society

hosted the event for the first time in 10 years. Abruscato said she hopes the historical society starts holding them on an annual basis.

Picnickers sang old songs like "She Wore a Tulip" and "My Gal Sal."

They also brought photos of when Wheeling was a much more rural community, said Abruscato,

who contributed photos of the old fire house and of Milwaukee Avenue when it was a gravel road.

Wheeling is unique among many area communities because it was founded more than 100 years ago. Like all suburbs, however, the village has experienced dramatic growth in recent decades.


