The newly formed Wheeling Club Library moved into an unused frame building in the rear parking lot of the former  
Wheeling Club on Wheeling Avenue, just west of the site of Dunwoody Road on October 13, 1978

The library moved to a double storey on Wheeling Avenue. With heavy seating, tables and chairs replaced by massive bookshelves

Outgrowing our space once again, the library moved to an empty church building on Jackson Court in June
